





- NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center Yokosuka (FLCY) provides Contracting support for Military Sealift Command (MSC) ship repair requirements within the Commander, US Pacific Fleet (COMPACFLT) Area of Responsibility (AOR)
- MSC Ship Support Unit (SSU), requires various ship repair such as
 - Voyage Repair (VRA) quarterly pier-side (14 days)
 - Mid-Term Availability (MTA) every 18 months (45-60 days)
 - Regular Overhaul (ROH) Dry Dock (DD) every 2.5 years (60-120 days)
 - Service Order (SOR)
 - Continuous maintenance whenever practical





- MSC requirements are solicited through Full and Open Competition to ALL potential Offerors in the AOR.
- Solicitations will be posted in AsiaNeco and Systems for Award Management (SAM) (https://sam.gov). FLCY intends on discontinuing courtesy email notices.
- USNS platforms no longer require Master Solicitation or Master Ship Repair Agreement (MSRA) / Agreement for Boat Repair (ABR) Agreement
- USS platforms still require MSRA/ABRs

Master Agreement for Repair and Alteration of Vessels (MARAV) (DFAR 217.71)

Master Ship Repair Agreement (MSRA)

- Contractor is capable of performing 55% of the work package of a vessel with these min. characteristics:
- length 387.6ft (118.1m), beam 57.7ft (17.6m), displacement approx. 3,400 MT full load, draft 14.1ft (4.3m)
- within their own facilities, utilizing own shops and workforce and/or resident subcontractors
- Capable of subcontracting and provide adequate oversight of subcontracted effort

Agreement for Boat Repair (ABR)

- Contractor is engaged in ship/boat/craft repair work
- Qualified in at least one trade specialties utilizing in-house personnel E.g. Ship fitting types of work, sheet metal work, non-nuclear welding, pipefitting
- Subcontractor relationships to cover other trade specialties

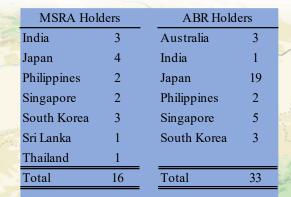

Eligibility/Capacity Requirements

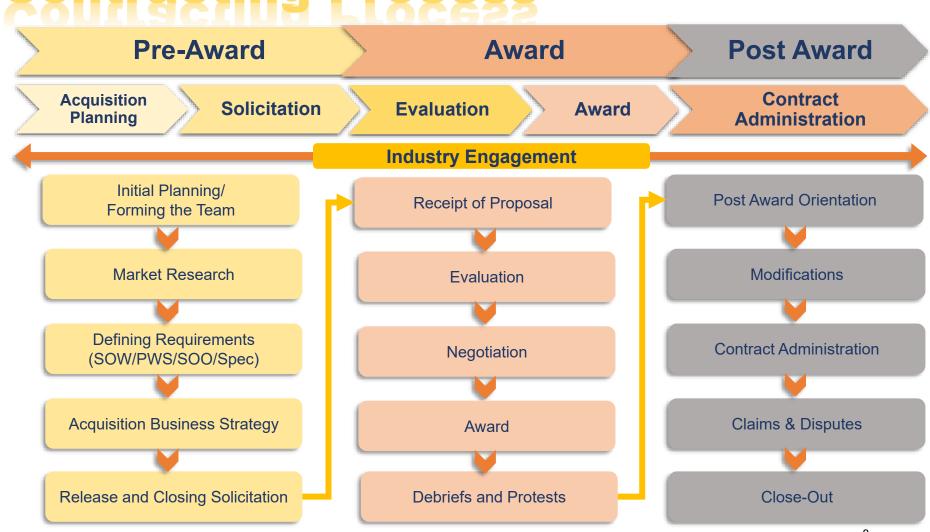
- Government evaluates a contractor's eligibility for a MSRA/ABR based on:
 - Administration/Management Control
 - > Financial Control
 - Production Control
 - Production Technical Support
 - Material/Procurement Control
 - Subcontractor Control
 - Quality Control
 - Safety/Security
 - ➤ Hazard Material/Waste Control
 - Facilities

- All MSC requirements will be solicited <u>individually</u>, potential Offerors must follow each solicitation's submission requirements and instructions.
- Requirements package: The work items (WI) package includes the Statement of Work (SOW), Reference Drawings, Technical Manual, MSC Corrective Maintenance Engineering Report, and other references.
- Place of Performance: Contractor's Facility or Navy Ports in the AOR. Place of performance will be specified at the time of Solicitation.
 - ➤ The Government reserves the right to conduct Port Assessments and/or Pre-Award site surveys as needed to validate the facility survey information. The Port Assessments and/or site surveys can be done anytime
- Contract Type: All requirements will be Firm-Fixed-Price.

Solicitation

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- Solicitation Process: All MSC ship repair requirements will be solicited through full and open competition and will be posted on AsiaNeco and SAM.gov
 - For requirements over Simplified Acquisition Threshold (SAT) (over \$250K) it will be posted for 30 days
- Solicitation Amendment: All amendments will be posted on AsiaNeco and SAM.gov. Offerors must submit a signed copy of all the Solicitation Amendments together with their offers.
- Question and Answer: For any aspect of the solicitation that is not clear, Offers may use Request for Specification Clarification to request clarification of any work item specification or contract term. The Government will provide responses to questions received via issuance of solicitation amendments
 - Shipyard can request Ship Checks, dependent upon the vessels availability and schedule

Section L of the Solicitation – Instructions, Conditions and Notices to Bidders

Most common for ROH/MTA will be to requested to submit the following:

Price Evaluation Factor (VOL 1)

- It should include the details of proposed labor hour, labor rate, material cost and other direct cost
- The Government may request certified cost or pricing data, data other than certified cost or pricing data, and supporting documents to be evaluated for adequacy.

Non-Price Evaluation Factors

- Technical (VOL 2)
- Past Performance (VOL 3)
- Cover Page and Other Submittal Requirements (VOL 4)
- MSRA/ABR for USS platforms requirement ONLY

Section M of the Solicitation – Evaluation Factors for Award:

- Price Factor
 - Price analysis in accordance with FAR 15.404-1 on the total price including options
- Technical Factors (Acceptable/Unacceptable Rating)
 - Factor 1 Understanding the Work Package
 - Factor 2 Ability to Perform the Work Item Package
 - Factor 3 Management Control and Quality Assurance
- Past Performance Factor (Acceptable/Unacceptable Rating)
 - ➤ Past Performance analysis within the past 3 years with US Government agencies, Government of the Offer's country, or private sector
- MSRA/ABR Factor (Acceptable/Unacceptable Rating)
 - Applies to USS platforms requirement ONLY

FAR 15.403-Certified Cost or Pricing Data (CCPD):

- Applies for requirements over \$2M
- ➤ FAR 15.403-4 Requiring CCPD and data other than CCPD to determine that price is fair and reasonable.
- ➤ A certificate of Current Cost or Pricing Data in the format in FAR 15.406-2 certifying that to the best of the person's knowledge and belief, the cost or pricing data is accurate, complete, and current as of a date certain before contract award.
- ➤ FAR 15.408 Table 15-2—Instructions for Submitting Cost/Price Proposals When Certified Cost or Pricing Data Are Required provides instructions for preparing a contracting pricing proposal

Award

- Compliance with Cost Accounting Standard (CAS): Applies for requirements over \$7.5M for OCONUS (48 CFR 9903.201-2)
 - CAS 401: Consistency in Estimating, Accumulating, and Reporting Costs
 - > CAS 402: Consistency in Allocating Costs Incurred for the Same Purpose
- Active SAM: Must have an active SAM account to compete and be awarded any individual requirements

Award:

- The Government intends to award without discussions with offerors, but reserves the right to conduct discussions if determined to be in the best interest of the Government.
- To be eligible for award, offerors shall meet the following criteria:
- Price: Total evaluated price determined fair and reasonable by KO
- Technical Factor Rating: Acceptable
- Past Performance Factor Rating: Acceptable
- MSRA/ABR: Acceptable (USS platforms ONLY)
- Be determined responsible under FAR part 9.104
- Award will be made based on Lowest Price Technically Acceptable (LPTA) Source Selection Process

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- Contract: A fully executed contract signed by the Contracting Officer will be issued to the awardee.
- Unsuccessful Notice: A written notification will be provided via email to Contractors whose proposal was not selected for award.
 - Contractors can request a debrief within 3 calendar days from the contract award notice date.
- Payment: Payment information will be provided under Section G-Contract Administration Data of the resulting contract. It will be processed in the currency used in the proposal and contract, usually within 30 days after receipt of completed invoice.
 - Invoice CLINs amount needs to match with the contract CLINs amount

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- The Contracting Officer is the only person authorized to approve any changes in the contract.
- Reporting Contractor Performance: For ship repair contracts that exceed \$500K. Information will be entered into Contractor Performance Assessment Reporting System (CPARS). This information will be use for future evaluation in source selections.
 - Ratings of Satisfactory or better is considered a good rating

Exceptional	Exceeds Many – Gov't Benefit	Few Minor

Satisfactory	Meets All	Some Minor

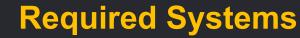

Solicitation

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- Conditional Found Report (CFR): A written report submit by the contractor identify the needed repairs and recommend corrective actions.
- Contract Change Order (CCO): A written document provided to change an aspect of an existing contract such as requirement, contract price, or period of performance which results in growth work, de-scope or new work. Contractor has 3 calendar days to submit proposal.
- Authorization To Proceed (ATP): KO will issue the written or verbal ATP once negotiation or price analysis completed.
- Modification: KO will issue the modification to capture the ATP(s)
